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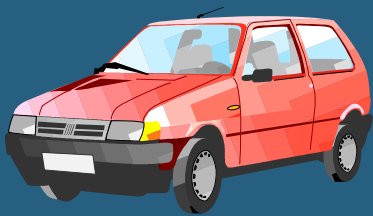
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What is a noun?

Noun is a word which refers to a thing, person, activity, place etc.

teacher

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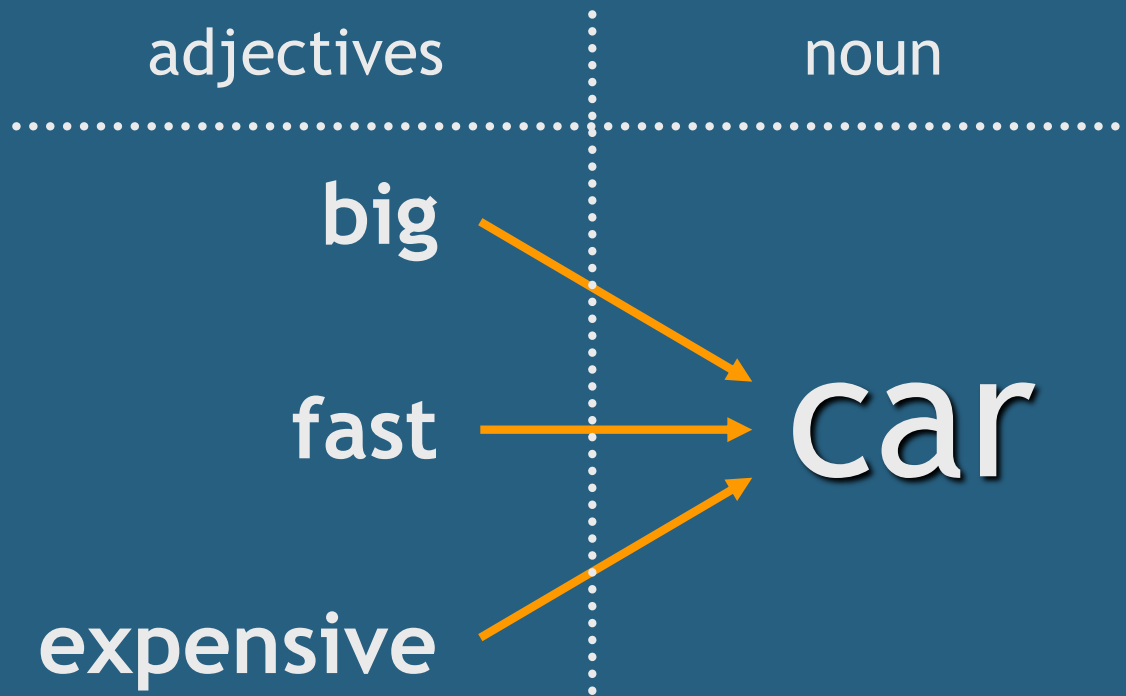
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What is an adjective?

Adjective is a word which describes a noun



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What is a syllable?

Syllable is a part of a word containing vowel sound

read ing

1st syllable

2nd syllable

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Syllables - examples

1. One-syllable adjectives

→ fast big cheap long

2. Two-syllable adjectives

→ happy crazy dirty

3. Three-syllable adjectives

→ important wonderful

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What is a “comparative form”?

Comparative form expresses the idea of ‘more’

fast-er

My car is fast.

But his car is faster.

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“Comparative form”?

How is a ‘comparative’ form built?

longer

two syllable adjectives
ending in -ly

funnier ⓘ

more modern

irregular adjectives
for example ‘good’

better

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What is a “superlative form”?

Comparative form expresses the idea of ‘most’

fast-**est**

My car is fast.
Your car is fast.

But his car is the **fastest**.

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“Superlative form”?

one syllable adjectives

longest

two syllable adjectives
ending in -ly

funniest ⓘ

other two and three
syllable adjectives

most modern

irregular adjectives
for example ‘good’

best
